COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course provides a look at the theological and philosophical basis for Worship Ministry in the local Church, as well as practical approaches in preparation and implementation. Leaders will learn how to develop a theology of worship framework, assemble a strategic plan and pathway for pastorally developing and shepherding a Worship Ministry.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- 1. To gain an understanding of the role & importance of Biblical worship.
- 2. To gain an understanding of the process & challenges of worship ministry
- 3. Explore various strategies & methods of worship ministry.
- 4. To learn practical tips from the experience of worship pastors.

1. CLASS REFLECTION: Write a <u>two (2) page</u> essay on how the content and experience of the class sessions will affect your life. (eg. changes in perspective, fresh insight, decision or choices to make in response to, or specific application to your future, etc). **Due: May 1st**

2. READING and REPORT: Read the course text in its entirety. Write a <u>three (3) page</u> report that summarizes the key concepts taught in the book and then include a paragraph on your thoughts/opinion on the book. Formatting: follow MLA format, see below for more info (Assignment Submissions). **Due May 1st**
