Practicum/Apprenticeship – Pt 105-O,205-O/Pt 307-O,407-O (1-2 Credits)

Students can gain credit for the work they are currently doing in their local church. Students pursuing an Associate in Theology can get one credit for 30 hours of ministry work and students pursuing an Associate in Church Leadership or a Bachelor of Theology can get two credits for 60 hours of ministry experience. All degrees require Practicum and/or Apprenticeship courses.
