Every Other Year Courses to be Offered this Fall

Juniors and Seniors, if any of these courses are required under your track, please take the course this semester. They will not be offered again until Fall 2026.

Leading People - Pa 313

Ken Malmin, 2 Credits

Juniors and Seniors: If you need to take this class for your emphasis please register for the course this semester as it will not be offered next year. Description: A study in the nature & practice of leadership as it applies to both individuals and groups.

Teaching Techniques - Ce213

Joanne Hubbard, 2 Credits

This course is composed of a variety of teaching techniques that can be adapted to various age groups, class sizes and educational situations. The student will learn and analyze several educational philosophies and theories as they relate to teaching. Emphasis will be placed on the characteristics of the learner in areas such as human development from birth through adult, learning styles and brain development. Characteristics of the teacher will also be studied as well as different teaching styles, including the place of technology and how to communicate to a changing world. Special attention will be given to teaching in cross-cultural settings and to the illiterate.

Church Administration – Pa403

George Burlo, 1 Credit

This course will now be offered as a 1 credit course instead of 2.

Marketplace Application I – Bu301

Patrice Tsague, 2 Credits

A biblically integrated business course that provides students with an understanding of the essential disciplines required to create and grow a successful, financially viable for-profit, non-profit venture, or project with societal, environmental, and spiritual impact. *Marketplace App 1* - will require the prerequisite of either *Marketplace Theology* or *Entrepreneurship Principles* in no particular order.

Marketplace Emphasis courses will now be taught during the Day instead of evening.
